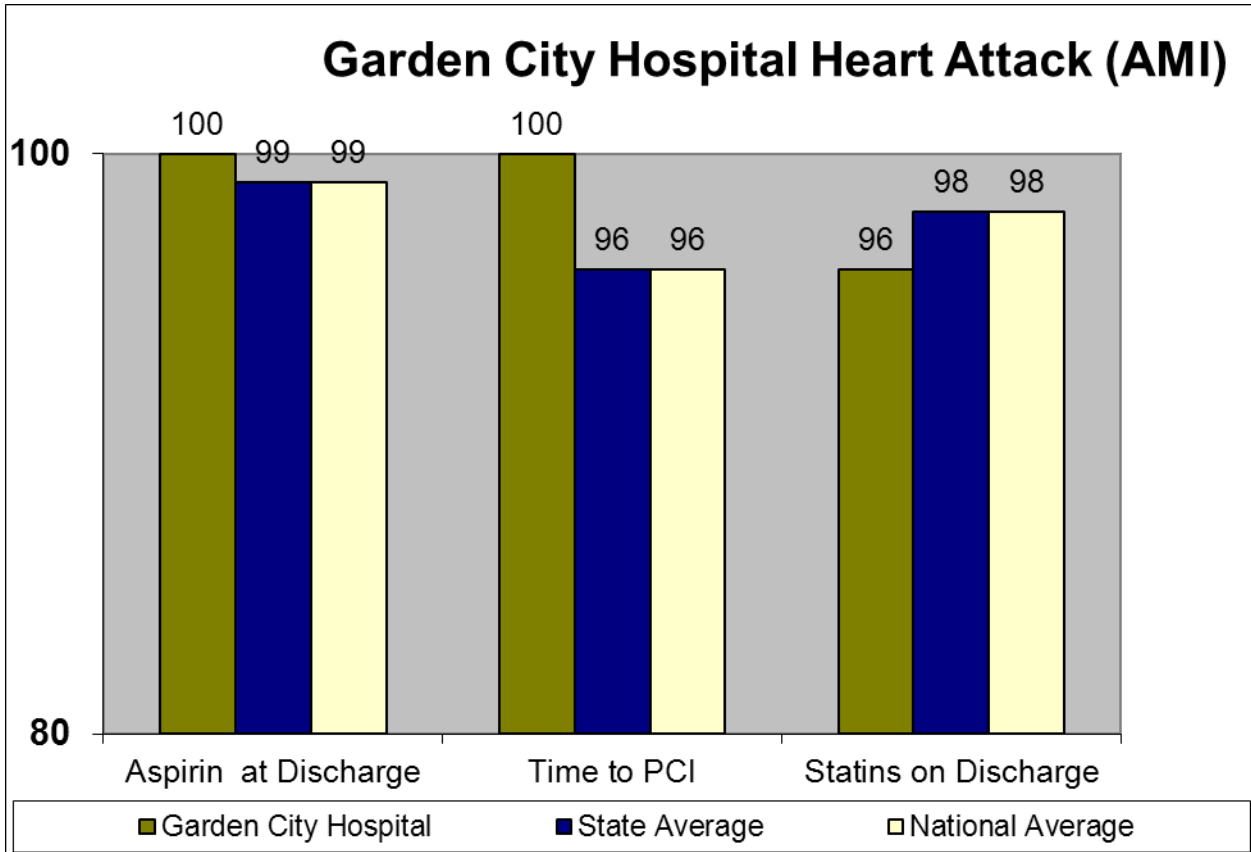


Acute Myocardial Infarction (AMI) - Heart Attack

A heart attack (also called AMI or acute myocardial infarction) happens when the arteries leading to the heart become blocked and the blood supply is slowed or stopped. These measures show some of the standards of care provided, if appropriate for most adults who have had a heart attack.
