Symptoms of a heart attack.

Men

In general, the three most commonly reported symptoms when men have a heart attack are:

- Chest pain
- Chest discomfort
- Chest pressure

While less common than those listed above, the following symptoms have been reported:

- Discomfort or pain in other areas, such as one or both arms, the neck, jaw, back, or stomach.
- Shortness of breath, lightheadedness, nausea, or sweating.
- Abdominal discomfort that may feel like heartburn.

Women

Common symptoms:

- Uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness or pain in the center of your chest that lasts more than a few minutes, or goes away and comes back.
- Pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw or stomach.
- Shortness of breath, with or without chest discomfort.
- Other signs such as breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness.

As with men, the most common heart attack symptom in women is chest pain or discomfort. But it's important to note that women are more likely to experience the other common symptoms, particularly shortness of breath, nauseal vomiting and back or jaw pain.

Garden City Hospital has a track record of success, offering rapid diagnosis and fast-track treatments before a cardiac situation worsens. Patients have the life-saving advantage of GCH 24/7 Heart Care and E.R. doctors working together to determine the most appropriate treatment.

Heart disease is the top cause of death in southeastern Michigan. "Treating heart attacks on a timely basis with PCI is critical in preventing further damage to the heart muscle. Having a full range of emergency and elective interventional services means. patients now have access to leading interventional cardiologists who can respond rapidly without needing to transfer patients for specialty or complex care. Fewer transfers means faster treatment and greater likelihood of positive outcomes." said Ashok Kondur. MD. lead GCH interventional

GCH is also expanding its vascular services to include peripheral artery procedures as well as a limb preservation clinic. "The availability of expanded vascular capabilities will also complement the hospital's wound care program," said Saju George, CEO. Garden City Hospital is one of the few hospitals in southeastern Michigan with an advanced wound program featuring a multi-person hyperbaric chamber. It's no wonder GCH has been designated among the top five percent of hospitals in the nation for its excellent performance in patient care.

What is PCI, or Angioplasty?

According to the American Heart Association, your heart's arteries

can become blocked or narrowed from a buildup of cholesterol, cells or other substances (plaque). This can reduce blood flow to your heart and cause chest discomfort. Sometimes a blood clot can suddenly form or get worse and completely block blood flow, leading to a heart attack. Angioplasty opens blocked arteries and restores normal blood flow to your heart muscle. Without major surgery. It is done by threading a catheter (thin tube) through a small puncture in a leg or arm artery to the heart. The blocked artery is opened by inflating a tiny balloon in it.

Why do I need it?

People with blockages in their heart arteries may need angioplasty if they are having lots of discomfort





in their chest, or if their blockages put them at risk of a heart attack or of dying.

At Prime Garden City Hospital, we've added new capabilities and heart experts who can perform this life saving procedure in both emergency and scheduled situations. It's our commitment to improving the expertise.

Know the Facts

According the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), Heart disease is the leading cause of death in the United States. More than 600,000 Americans die of heart disease each year. That's one in every four deaths in this country. The term "heart disease" refers to several types of heart conditions. The most common type is coronary artery disease, which can cause heart attack. Other kinds of heart disease may involve the valves in the heart,

or the heart may not pump well and cause heart failure. Some people are born with heart disease.

Are you at risk?

Anyone, including children, can develop heart disease. It occurs when a substance called plaque builds up in your arteries. When this happens, your arteries can narrow over time, reducing blood flow to the heart.

Smoking, eating an unhealthy diet, and not getting enough exercise all increase your risk for having heart disease. Having high cholesterol, high blood pressure, or diabetes also can increase your risk for heart disease. Ask your doctor about preventing or treating these medical conditions.

Warning signs of Stroke: Act F.A.S.T. American Heart Association

Stroke is not only the No. 4 cause of death in the United States, it's also a leading cause of severe, long-term disability. That's why it's important to act immediately. Research conducted by The American Stroke Association shows that patients who take a clot-busting drug, or thrombolytic, within three hours of their first stroke symptom can reduce long-term disability from ischemic stroke – the most common type, accounting for about 87 percent of all cases.

- Sudden numbness or weakness of the face, arm or leg, especially on one side of the body
- Sudden confusion, trouble speaking or understanding
- Sudden trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination
- Sudden severe headache with no known cause

You should never wait more than five minutes to dial 9-1-1 if you experience even one of the signs above. Remember, you could be having a stroke even if you're not experiencing all of the symptoms. Remember to check the time. The responding emergency medical technician or ER nurse

at the hospital will need to know

when the first symptom occurred.
